

Recording his seventh stakes win, **Air Assault**, trained by Andrew Gluyas, delivered an exceptional performance at Morphettville on Melbourne Cup day. He surged ahead to win by over six and a half lengths, marking his second consecutive triumph in the Listed SAJC John Letts Cup (1800m). Bred by Harry Perks, Toorak Thoroughbred Breeding Trust, trained by Andrew Gluyas Air Assault's next run will be in the Ballarat Cup on Saturday the 6<sup>th</sup> December.

The dynamic **Guru Warrior** has celebrated victories in his last four outings. Sired by Saxon Warrior (Jpn) and out of the dam Glory Guru, he is both bred and raced by The Quality Thoroughbred Breeding Joint Venture.

Guru Warrior, a 4-year-old gelding, achieved his most notable career win on November 15<sup>th</sup> at Morphettville under the guidance of trainer Andrew Gluyas and ridden by Jason Holder, his performance was impressive.

Despite facing one of the widest barriers in the \$500,000 Listed Cranbourne Cup (1600m), **Sabaj**, trained by Mick Price and Michael Kent Jnr, secured a stylish victory. Sabaj clearly demonstrates significant potential and appears to be on the path to becoming a future group winner.

The horse also claimed victory in its previous race over Spring Carnival, BM 78. Bred by South Australia-based Ms. A. Rossi, Joe Piteo, Paul Piteo, and Pat Hodby - Sired by Manhattan Rain from mare Bouzy, Sabaj has earned a total of \$548,000. Congratulations to all involved!

**Galaxy Patch** has established a strong reputation for himself. On November 23rd, he achieved an exhilarating victory for James McDonald & Pierre Ng in the Group II BOCHK Private Wealth Jockey Club Mile (1600m) at Sha Tin, HK. Galaxy Patch had previously secured a third-place finish in this event last year. This year, however, he appears to be performing even better.

This result makes the upcoming HK\$36 million G1 LONGINES Hong Kong Mile (1600m) on December 14th an exciting prospect. Bred by Rob & Maureen McBryde, Summerset Park, Gumeracha, sired by Wandjina x Voltara.
